

Themistocles Found Not Guilty

More than 500 people gathered at Chicago's Harris Theater on April 1 to decide the fate of ancient Athenian hero Themistocles in the latest installment of the National Hellenic Museum's popular Trial Series. After spirited arguments from both sides, the audience overwhelmingly found Themistocles "not guilty" of treason.

Defense attorneys Patrick M. Collins, Tinos
Diamantatos, and Katerina Alexopoulos led the
winning case, while prosecutors Sarah F. King
and Patrick A. Salvi II argued for conviction. The
judges were Justice Joy V. Cunningham (Illinois
Supreme Court), Hon. Georgia N. Alexakis (U.S.
District Court for the Northern District of Illinois),
Hon. Anthony C. Kyriakopoulos (Circuit Court of
Cook County) and Hon. Jeffery G. Chrones (Circuit






Court of Cook County). The onstage jury made up of civic and community leaders voted 11–1 to acquit Themistocles.






An Evening with Some of Chicago's Top Historians: A Captivating Conversation on Post-Antique Greece
